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## UNION NEWS



Hello, APSS members!

As we transition into fall 2025, we transition into a **new contractual agreement** between the Alliance and our employer, one which was overwhelmingly ratified by APSS membership – an agreement that directly reflects the will and position of the APSS membership as expressed to the APSS Bargaining Committee in last year’s survey. I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude for those who provided feedback in our survey that shaped our work, as well as those who attended the ratification meetings who asked the hard questions and leaned into the very real conversations that we have at the bargaining table on your behalf.

On behalf of your APSS Bargaining Committee, I am proud to have delivered another 4-year agreement with our employer – notably, one which guarantees an at-least 4.9% increase in the first year; at-least a 3% increase in the second year; and a me-too clause with no cap (we get what faculty/EAP get) in years three and four, with step advancement in each year. This is all more important considering there was no change to the current cost-sharing plans for our retirement benefits (both defined benefit and defined contribution).

There were a lot of other changes to contractual language, and clauses that may matter as it pertains to your employment at GVSU: Section 7.1 (vacancies and transfers), Section 12.3 (salary continuation), and, specifically, Section 12.3.4 (ESTA), come to mind, but there is no shortage of examples of contractual language changes.

The APSS Bargaining Team accepts the work and responsibility to show up at the negotiating table to work for the interests of all our bargaining unit members. As I transition away from the work of active negotiations, I will work toward answering any questions or concerns that come from you, our membership, as it relates to the intersections between your professional experiences and our contractual agreement. Please connect with me if there are any specific topics or questions that you would like me to highlight in future articles – either by name or anonymously, no judgement. The work that we do is on behalf of our bargaining-unit membership.






## MASTER STORYTELLING CLASS

As part of our commitment to sustainability and efficiency, GVSU is offering you the option to receive your IRS Form 1095-C electronically.


Recent updates under the Paperwork Reduction Act allow employers to provide this form electronically and no longer require mailing paper forms. Receiving your 1095-C electronically is secure, faster, and environmentally friendly. The form provides important information about your health coverage and is used when completing your federal tax return.

What You Need to Do:

- Login to Workday.
- Go to the 1095-C Electronic Consent section.
- Confirm your consent to receive the form electronically.

## CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS MONTH: WATCH OUT FOR PHISHING JOB SCAMS

As part of Cybersecurity Awareness Month, we want to remind the GVSU community to stay alert for phishing scams—especially those targeting our students. A common scam making the rounds involves fake job offers that appear to come from professors.



Here's the red flag: **if the email does not come from a @gvsu.edu account, it's a scam.** Scammers often create look-alike addresses from Gmail, Yahoo, or Outlook in an attempt to trick students into thinking the offer is legitimate.

These fraudulent emails often:

- Promise easy or high-paying “assistant” jobs.
- Ask for personal information, such as a phone number, address, or banking details.
- Request that students purchase gift cards or transfer money.

### What students (and staff) can do:

- Double-check the sender's email address. Official GVSU emails will always come from a @gvsu.edu account.
- Be cautious with unsolicited job offers, especially those with vague details or urgent instructions.
- Report suspicious messages by using the Phish Alert button in Outlook or forwarding them to [phish@gvsu.edu](mailto:phish@gvsu.edu).

By helping our students recognize these warning signs, we can protect them from financial loss and keep the GVSU community secure.

Recommended by **Kelli Dykstra** (Public Safety):



**Gina Rickert** (College of Computing)'s recipe for **Cheesy Chicken Enchiladas**:

### Ingredients:

1 rotisserie chicken (shredded)  
 Cooked bacon (any amount of your choosing)  
 3/4 cup Colby Jack Shredded Cheese  
 1/8 cup Ranch Seasoning (or two 1 oz ranch packets)  
 1 block (8oz) Cream Cheese  
 Dollop of Daisy Sour Cream (measure with your stomach/heart)  
 8-10 Tortillas  
 1 cup Red Enchilada Sauce  
 1/2 cup Heavy Whipping Cream  
 1/2-3/4 cup Shredded Cheese (to sprinkle on top)


### Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 oF

In a bowl combine chicken, bacon, shredded cheese, ranch seasoning cream cheese and sour cream. Mix until well combined. Warm tortillas to prevent cracking when rolling. Place chicken filling in tortillas and roll up, depending on how full the mixture could make 8, 10, or 12 tortillas. Then place in a 9x13 baking pan. Combine enchilada sauce and whipping cream and pour over tortillas. Sprinkle additional shredded cheese on top as needed. Bake for 35 minutes until warmed. Enjoy!

\*\*if prepped beforehand or refrigerated, then bake for 40-45 mins.
